

The project was dedicated to the study and dissemination of information about transformation of identities in Europe and Russia given historical background and modern trends. The project aimed to consider the formation of modern identities in the context of the interconnected influence and mutual exchange of cultures in the modern world.

In the framework of the project, seven events were held:

- Workshop "Civil society and social identity formation"
- Two rounds of focus groups and interviews with European and Russian students "European and national identity: the views from young people"
- International Conference "Transformation of identities: the experience of the EU and Russia"
- Conference "European and Russian identity: challenges and tendencies"
- Summer school for HEI teachers "Teaching the European Union: current trends and tendencies"
- International Conference "Modern European society: identity transformation in the EU and Russia"

- book on Modern European Society
- booklet for students on modern challenges of European and Russian identities
